High School Rotating-Drop Schedule

The undersigned parties hereby agree that the following modification to the collective bargaining agreement currently in effect will be implemented effective July 1, 2011, notwithstanding any lack of a full agreement to a successor contract.

DELETE current Article V:IV:D as written.

INSERT the following REVISED or NEW language.

Article V:IV:D.1 [REVISION]

- 1. **If the high school remains on or returns to a nine period day** each high school teaching staff member shall have one [1] on-call period, one [1] preparation period and one [1] lunch period per day.

Article V:IV:D.2 [NEW]

- 2. **If the high school adopts a rotating-drop schedule with a four [4] day rotation, each high school teaching staff member shall have a lunch period every day, a preparation period every day, and a minimum of three [3] on-call periods per four [4] day cycle (two [2] on-call periods for Science teachers per four [4] day cycle), and no more than one [1] lunch duty per four [4] day cycle.**

Article V:IV:D.3 [REVISION]

- The on-call period is a duty-free period to be utilized on a **non-routine basis. A non-routine basis is defined as a situation where an assignment, meeting or duty is not assigned to a particular teacher on a regular basis.**

Article V:IV:D.4 [Current language]

- It is agreed that in the event LHS is returned to an eight [8] period day, the LEA reserves the right to bargain the impact of more than a five [5] minute change in each period.
